








FROM THE EDITOR - FRANK BAKER





DIRECT FROM THE DIRECTOR - VERRYL FOSNIGHT



The main news of the Pacific Southwest Region is the working out the details of the PSR Forum, an online information center for the whole region. It will be used to announce information about meetings, conventions, and a place to post questions, especially about modeling, and to read answers and sugges tions. The Forum is meant to replace the newsletter each Division puts out (*The Spurline* in the AZ Div). It would shift the great amount of work from one person, the editor, to anyone or everyone in the division and thus foster more

communication, friendships, and help for all in the Region.

The Forum probably will have a top page available to guests or non-members. They can see part of what is inside but not post. The rest will have a restricted section for NMRA members. The pros of restricting part of the Forum is to encourage non-NMRA members to join and thus fund the NMRA. Conversely, a completely open Forum would spread the word about NMRA more to make it more attractive to join. Thus non-NMRA members can get info about the hobby, the Region and the Divisions, see the help within the NMRA and perhaps be inspired to join the NMRA.

The Forum is up and running but very preliminary. To see it go to the PSR Region site http://www.psrnmra.org/ and click on the "Forums" tab. This takes you to the top level of the Forum, the level for Region news and information. There will be 4 sub levels or sub forums, one for each Division. You must login to get to them. There are planned to be a few major headings within the Division Forums. Clubs would have a page within their Division's pages.

There is a consensus building on the PRS Board that all 4 Division Forums should be open to all logged-in members, so an Arizona Division member can read the other forums. This opens it up for more inter-Division communication and help, and in southern California solves the problem of members who are active in more than one division, i.e., belong to multiple clubs.

Frank Baker has suggested a few topics or pages for the AZ Division Forum: **Calendar**(of model railroad events thru the year and can be added by any member); **Officers**(a sub thread where the division offers have to communicate ideas, regional meets, etc.); **Mailbag** (a general thread where members can post); **Social Programs** (discussion pages(s) of programs with scouts, schools, etc..) Club News (Posting by NMRA and non-NMRA clubs), **Marketplace** (place to sell/buy-member to member only – no hobby shops, unless they are an NMRA member and donate to the division) (they could be included in a hobby shop directory) and finally, **Meet results** (contest and meet information from most recent divisional meet. I would add a **Help Desk** to this list for members to post problems or how-to questions and get feedback.

Each Division needs a moderator volunteer. The moderator's job is to monitor the Division forums, watch what is being posted, take care of problems, and organize the initial structure of that Division's pages or topics. If you are interested, write me or Frank Baker for more info. I imagine the job to be like owning or moderating a Yahoo Group. Once it is set up it requires almost no management. I have owned 6 or 8 Yahoo Groups, and never have anything to do other than an occasional post to push a discussion back into a rational direction.

This year's Regional convention is being planned and hosted by the Los Angeles Division of the PSR. It will be the "LA Junction," from September 21-24, 2016. I will be held at the DoubleTree Hotel Los Angeles – Westside and is central to many of the activities, tours of some of the finest layouts in Southern California, excellent behind the scenes tours of prototype railroad facilities, a selection of clinics and more. CHIEF CLERK & PAYMASTER REPORT

The March 12, 2016 Meet in Sun City provided a net profit of \$385.40 on a total income of \$465.00 as shown in the Table below. This profit is significant since the registration fee for NMRA members was reduced from \$10.00 to \$5.00 beginning with this meet. Offsetting the reduction in the entry fee is a free venue. Non-member registration remained at \$10.00, but includes a six-month membership to the NMRA. There were total of 92 attendees which were comprised of 74 NMRA members, 8 new members, and 10 guests. This compares almost identically to the

94 attendees (of which 77 were members) at last years' meet.

The primary source of income from the meet was the door receipts plus \$10 from the sale of a swap meet table. The only direct expense was the cost of enrolling the new members.

Tom Draper provided a report on the Arizona Division, PSR 2015 Conference held in Scottsdale which was attended 273 people. This conference was a great success with a total income of \$36,554.66. After expenses the net profit for the conference was \$9,898.51 which provides the Arizona Division with \$6,702.41 income. However, the account at Wells Fargo Bank that was opened for the PSR convention cannot be closed out until Aug 2017. In order to avoid monthly charges, a \$700.00 balance was left in this account. Therefore, a total of \$6002.41 has been deposited in the Arizona Division account and \$700.00 will be carried as an account receivable until next year.

After adding the Az. Div. income from the PSR Conference and the profits of the March 12, meet (plus minor interest payments) the checkbook balance is now \$11,391.25. The change from the last balance of \$5187.37 reflects debits for ImageWorx and a check to the PSR Convention to buy excess pins and patches. The amount for the pins and patches was added to the total convention profit and so most of it returned to the Division. The Division is currently in a very good financial condition and the lower \$5.00 admission fee will continue into the future.
