Golden Spike

However, in some cases, mine included, the early AP certificates were for non-modeling achievements. In my case, I earned Chief Dispatcher, Author and Volunteer before I earned any of the artistic certificates. I got Structures and then Cars. I had planned on getting Scenery on the club layout and doing my Golden Spike then. Well, I got ahead of myself and did not apply for my Golden Spike. Instead, I went for the Engineering awards and submitted my SOQ for MMR, not realizing that I was cutting off my ability to qualify for the Golden Spike.

So, if you aren't following the "path" with Golden Spike leading the way, be sure to apply for it before you submit your MMR SOQ. Otherwise, you will be left out in the cold, as I am.

Carl Heimberger, the PSR AP manager and I, the AZ division manager, are both aware of and watchful for this. We hope to make sure it doesn't happen to others. Do yourself a favor and keep it in mind, too.
