





Account Balance, December 31, 2009



Spur Line Print Version Subscriptions are Coming Please Help!

We have been trying to convert most of the membership to the e-Spur Line. As you are receiving this, you are helping us reduce division expenses. Please help us convert more of the members. Many of us have friends who are on email regularly, but still get the print version of the Spur Line. We need your help in getting them to make the switch to the e-Spur Line.

One of the most significant expenses for our division is the cost of producing the print version of the Spur Line. For the last issue, we spent over \$450 dollars just for the last issue. The bottom line is that we spend over \$1500 per year for the print version. Arizona is the only division in the PSR not charging for the print version, and we have the fewest subscribers to our electronic newsletter. We do realize that not everyone has internet access and we still want to make the Spur Line available to them

Our goal is not to render a profit, but to cover the costs to print and mail the print version of the newsletter. So, effective January 1, 2011, we will begin charging an annual subscription. The fee will be \$5.00 per year which will cover the printing and mailing costs for the three issues per year.



Spur Line Railroad Quiz - Answers for the Spring Questions

- What Is the longest railroad bridge in the United States?
 Answer: The famous Lucin Cut-off, carrying the tracks of the Southern Pacific Railroad across
 - the Great Salt Lake in Utah, is the longest railroad bridge structure in the United States. It is of pile-trestle construction, 19 miles in length, and was completed in 1903.
- 2. What is a car mile?
 - Answer: The transportation of a car one mile, known as a "car-mile," is the unit of a car movement employed in computing train service costs and efficiency.
- 3. What was the first Railway Charter in the United States?
 - Answer: In 1815, John Stevens, of Hoboken, obtained a charter from the State of New Jersey to build and operate a steam railroad between New Brunswick and Trenton, New Jersey. The charter expired without the railroad being built, but the idea persisted and on March 7, 1832, the new Jersey Railroad & Transportation Company (now a part of the Pennsylvania Railroad) was chartered to build across the state. On January 1, 1839, the railroad was operated between New Brunswick and Trenton.

Summer Spur Line Railroad Quiz Answers

1. What Is the longest railway tunnel in the United States?

Answer: The Cascade Tunnel, of the Great Northern Railroad, through the Cascade Mountains in Chelan and King Counties, Washington, is 41,152 feet (7.79 miles) in length, and is the longest railway tunnel in the Western Hemisphere. It was completed in 1929. In the construction of this tunnel, boring was started simultaneously at the eastern and western portals, nearly eight miles apart, and when the construction forces met in the center, after many months of continuous boring, they found that they were only a fraction of a foot out of perfect alignment.

2. What was the first railway bridge across the Mississippi River? Answer: The Rock Island Railroad bridge at Davenport, Iowa was opened in 1855, was the first to span the Mississippi River. Built of wood, resting on stone piers, this 1,582-foot structure was described as "the mechanical wonder of the West." The first locomotive, the "Des Moines," crossed the bridge on April 21, 1855.

3. What is an L.C.L. shipment?

Answer: Any shipment of freight which is too small to move on a carload rate is called an L.C.L. shipment, the initials meaning literally "less than car-load." Such shipments, usually consisting of crates, cartons, boxes, barrels, etc., are handled in package cars with other L.C.L. shipments.




